The Gentlemen's Quest of Tampa, Inc., is dedicated to helping at-risk participants to realize their full potential. Every year, a new cohort of 25 male students are accepted to the program. Young men are encouraged to grow academically, socially, and emotionally. Life lessons, including a dress code, public speaking, and participating in activities that elevate them. Gentlemen's Quest has a 100% graduation rate, and a 100% transition rate as the grads entered college or the military.

"Our program has this level of success because of the structure of the program. Every GQ student must maximize their

"Their lives depend on these opportunities, and we have to give them to youth that will put in the work because for some of them, their lives depend on it."
