Letter From Our CEO Ernest M. Coney, Jr

Over the last 32 years, the CDC of Tampa has been employing an all-encompassing approach to significantly change struggling neighborhoods—not due to a lack of work ethic, character, or ambition, but because they are starved of resources and opportunities. Have you ever driven through an area littered with trash and debris, where pawnshops and liquor stores outnumber banks and doctors' offices? The physical decay and neglect of one neighborhood lead to the depletion of resources and hope, starkly contrasting with the opportunities blossoming in other areas, where ideas are supported and ambitions are nurtured. Our duty, indeed our mission, is to create communities of opportunity, where everyone can realize their God-given potential.

The initial step is to channel capital and resources into communities like East Tampa. Similar to the prophet Nehemiah, CDC of Tampa has been advocating for resources to rebuild. We are deeply thankful for funders such as Valley Bank, Suncoast Credit Union, The Rockefeller Foundation, Fifth Third Bank, and Raymond James, who have helped us raise \$6 million. Our objective is to raise \$10 million over the next few years to develop 1,000 units of housing and 100,000 square feet of commercial space. Stabilizing our neighborhoods through homeownership and the development of commercial areas and job centers are crucial components in creating communities of opportunity.

We have made a strong start in achieving our goals. In 2023, we secured a contract on Armature Place Apartments, a 96-unit complex, using the Nehemiah Legacy Fund. Hillsborough County provided the funds to acquire the project and cover 50% of the rehabilitation costs. The City also invested, with the remainder of the rehabilitation being completed with the Nehemiah Fund. By 2024, we were able to celebrate the ribbon-cutting, where residents shared testimonials about the affordability and quality of the housing after the rehabilitation. One tenant even expressed his desire to invest further, saying to his wife, "We should get some new furniture for this beautiful place." His words reflected his appreciation and dreams of a better quality of life.

In this decade, I foresee the rise of communities of opportunity and the transformation of neighborhoods where poverty indicators become intangible and the promises of God become evident. Thank you for your investment and partnership over the past 32 years. You have always responded to the call and met the challenge. We look forward to the future and the many blessings and opportunities that will be available to our residents because of your dedicated efforts.

Tampa Fire Rescue, in partnership with the CDC of Tampa, celebrated the graduation of the fifth annual **FIRE Academy** on Friday, July 26th, at HCC's Public Service Technology Building. This ceremony marked the conclusion of a demanding summer program where participants not only delved into potential career opportunities but also mastered critical life-saving techniques.

CDC of Tampa organizes the Fire Introduction Resources and Education (FIRE) Academy to inspire high school students, aged 15-18, to explore a variety of career paths. This initiative addresses the issue of youth unemployment by providing students with industry-recognized certifications and preparing them for college. By introducing both traditional and non-traditional career options, the program honors and embraces the diversity of its participants.

"Our FIRE Academy program, established in 2020, was designed to raise awareness about firefighting as a career and to facilitate engagement between students, public servants, and firefighters," explained Alexandria Andrade, Coordinator of the FIRE Academy at CDC of Tampa. "Nearly 70 young individuals have benefitted from this program, with some opting to pursue careers in first response after high school."

Long Term Disaster Recovery Center

The CDC of Tampa received \$300,000 from the American Red Cross to launch the "Long Term Disaster Recovery Center" Pilot Program. This initiative, in collaboration with the 11th District of the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church, aims to educate at-risk community members on disaster preparedness and recovery while establishing a center to disseminate crucial information to impacted regions.

"Bishop Frank Madison Reid III and Supervisor Marlaa Hall Reid, leaders of the 11th Episcopal District, along with Rev. James Givens, Pastor of Mt. Olive AME Church in Ft. Myers, strive to provide sustained recovery services in underserved communities," stated Rev. Gregory Gay, Disaster Relief Coordinator for the 11th Episcopal District. "These services are fundamental in aiding those in need."

The grant was used to support various disaster recovery projects through the CDC of Tampa, Mt. Olive AME, and a network of service providers. The assistance offered included helping Lee County residents find stable employment in high-growth industries, educating them on disaster preparedness and response, conducting small business recovery workshops and counseling, offering spiritual and mental health support, managing property insurance coordination, and providing financial literacy education. Services beyond the network's capacity were referred to appropriate community resources.

Real Estate Highlights

We proudly announced the start of building **Gardens at Diana Point North!** After the recent hurricanes, we are entering an exciting new phase where the aspirations of 24 families are becoming a reality.

Gardens at Diana Point North is not merely a housing project; it stands as a symbol of hope for families and showcases the impact of collaborative efforts in creating sustainable, affordable homes. This initiative has been made possible through HOME – Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) Funds from Hillsborough County, amounting to \$4.2 million. Additional funding includes New Market Tax Credits (NMTC) from Smith & Associates, a construction loan from Community Housing Capital, Inc., a U.S. Treasury-certified Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI), and an Empowering Black Futures grant from Fifth Third Bank.

We take immense pride in our productive partnership with Hillsborough County, as we strive to provide affordable housing for residents. In 2022, leveraging a grant from the County's American Rescue Plan funds, CDC of Tampa acquired **Armature Place Apartments.** This strategic acquisition aimed to maintain affordable housing for vulnerable families by refurbishing the units and ensuring their long-term affordability.

The funding enabled us to complete the refurbishment of Armature Place Apartments by 2024, guaranteeing that diligent families in Hillsborough County have access to quality, safe, and reasonably priced homes. We celebrate the successful completion of this renovation and our collaboration with the County, which ensures these units remain affordable for many years ahead.

CDC of Tampa is turning to technology to address the need for more affordable housing in Hillsborough County. We held a community event to showcase how a **3D printer** can construct exterior walls both rapidly and cost-effectively. Acquired with a \$500,000 grant from Hillsborough County, this printer will play a pivotal role in our strategy to develop budget-friendly homes in the area. Initially, the 3D printer will be dedicated to fabricating concrete exterior walls, but its applications may later extend to other parts of home construction.

Hillsborough County's funded programs and services aim to create new affordable housing opportunities, provide career training to help residents achieve home ownership, and make infrastructure improvements that benefit local communities. 
Rock The Block
